Everyone faces tough struggles and hard questions. This assembly program highlights three ideals that can help with conflict resolution and improving relationships.

Value: Each person is valuable and has tremendous worth, no matter what happens to them. Hold tight to life, and do not discard it.

Courage: Each person can say no to destructive choices, and have the courage to stand up for what's right. Don't go with the crowd...make the choice that's best for you, others, and society.

Respect: Respect each other without building walls of division. Respect diversity because differences make us unique.

Creating An Unshakable Self Image

Society's system of determining self-worth is broken, unfair and controlling. Bob speaks on making decisions to build self-worth, appreciate uniqueness and discover identity. He encourages students to fight against the broken system and stand up for the value of every person and join the Dignity Revolution.

The Choice Is Yours

Students might not recognize the simple truth that they make choices every day that affects their relationships and their future. Through energizing stories and down-to-earth language, Bob opens their eyes to see:

- Every choice has a consequence.
- If you give in to fear, you'll make bad choices.
- The loving choice is always the best choice.
- To decide if it is a loving choice ask: Is it good for others? Is it good for me? Is it good for society?
